

Panola County Groundwater Conservation District
Minutes of Public Hearing on
Operating Permit Applications
July 25, 2023

A Public Hearing was held by the Panola County Groundwater Conservation District Board of Directors at 5:30p.m. in the District Conference Room at 419 W. Sabine Street, Carthage, Texas 75633 on Tuesday, July 25, 2023, on the application for an Operating Permits for Chris Adams and Socagee Midstream Gas Services LLC.

1. The Public Hearing was called to order by Mike Pennington, Board President, at 5:30 p.m. on Tuesday, July 25, 2023.
2. Mr. Pennington moved into review of the Operating Permit application for Chris Adams. He asked the General Manager to present the application. The General Manager then explained that Chris Adams applied to operate two (2) water wells for water sales. The total combined usage applied for is 47,304,000 gallons or 145.17 acre-feet annually.

Based on the presented information for the applicant and the fact that the application had met all the requirements of the District Rules and Chapter 36, TWC, the General Manger recommended that the Board approve the application. Danny Reed moved, and Charles Foster seconded the motion to approve the Operating Permit. The motion passed unanimously of those present.


3. Mr. Pennington moved into review of the Operating Permit Amendment application for Socagee Midstream Gas Services LLC. He asked the General Manager to present the application. The General Manager then explained that Socagee Midstream Gas Services LLC, applied for a permit amendment to operate one (1) water well for industrial use. The additional

potential maximum annual groundwater production from this well is 15,768,000 gallons or 48.39 acre-feet annually an estimated increase of withdrawal of 30 gallons per minute.


